


book's findings and lessons learned are highly relevant and necessary for policymakers and researchers in Southeast Asia and beyond.






Climate change causes considerable damage to human society. This article discusses Cambodia's efforts in tackling climate change and provides recommendations on addressing the challenges.

AVI Perspective on Foreign A. and Neoliberalism



This article examines the current global distribution of aid from the dependency theory perspective. It argues that foreign aid and neoliberalism are intertwined. Thirdworld countries rely heavily on foreign aid for their growth. In providing aid, donor countries receive more advantages than recipient countries. Moreover. donor countries can use aid to mask their hegemonic ambitions, economic dominance, and power. Thus, the sovereignty of thirdworld states could be undermined, resulting in neo-colonialism.
